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Bogdan Athanassov is an assistant professor of prehistoric archaeology and the director of the Laboratory of Archaeometry and Experimental Archaeology in the Department of Archaeology at New Bulgarian University. His research interests include the late prehistory of the Eastern Mediterranean and Southeastern Europe, theoretical archaeology, and presenting the past to a wider audience. His publications deal with the end of the Bronze Age in the western Black Sea region, contact studies, the social role of architecture and the built environment, and the social significance of food in late prehistory. From 2012 to 2023, he was co-director of the German-Bulgarian archaeological excavations in Bresto, near the village of Banya in southwestern Bulgaria. Since 2025, he has been co-directing a German-Bulgarian archaeological project studying prehistoric settlements and landscapes in the Nova Zagora area. He is also a member of the Scientific Board of the “Germania” journal, published by the German Archaeological Institute.

Magdalena Bozhkova is a lecturer in French language and literature at the Department of Foreign Languages and Cultures, New Bulgarian University. She leads the NBU team in the annual project of the Goncourt Academy and the French Institute “Goncourt – Bulgaria.” She co-organizes the university discussion club “Novel and its Screen Adaptation” focused on French-language literature and cinema, and takes part in various cultural and educational initiatives. Her research and teaching interests cover French language, literature, and culture, as well as innovative approaches to teaching literary history and theory.

Ivayla Alexandrova graduated in Journalism from Sofia University and Film Criticism from National Academy for Theatre and Film Arts in Sofia. She works as a journalist for Bulgarian National Radio. Her documentary series 1989 won the 2009 *Sirak Skitnik* Award from BNR in 2009. She is co-writer of the radio series “*The Second World War*”. In 2008, her documentary novel “*Hot*

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Hristo Chukurliev is an Associate Professor at New Bulgarian University (NBU), Sofia, where he teaches across humanities and education programs and serves as Director of the Central University Administration.
